MINISTRY TO THE SICK & HOMEBOUND

Call the parish office to make arrangements to administer this sacrament for one who is sick or homebound or in the hospital. The Parish Priests visit the sick & homebound and administer the Holy Eucharist, the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the sacrament of the sick on the First Friday of the month. Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist bring Holy Communion to the sick and homebound on weekends.

MARRIAGE

Call the parish office and make an appointment with one of the parish priests for the required preparations and to set the wedding date. Ordinarily preparations will take at least six months.

QUINCEAÑERAS

Call one of the parish priests to make an appointment to set the quinceañera date. The quinceañera is expected to have received all three Sacraments of initiation. Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. The family is expected to be registered and worship in the parish. Preparations will take at least six months.

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR:

How many times do we, like casting directors, judge people by their appearance, voice, or ethnic background? Maybe we wait to learn more about their education, work, family or financial situation. Sooner or later we stereotype people. And once we have put them in those boxes, it becomes impossible to imagine them in any other way. We limit our vision of who we/others are, and who we/others might become.

The story of how the prophet Samuel chose David to be king of Israel is one of the most beloved stories in the Bible. There are elements of both humor and drama in the narrative, but the key point is contained in the line, 'Not as man sees does God see' (1 Samuel 16:7). The author wants us to be clear about the fact that God is guiding the destiny of Israel and that our human efforts will be successful only to the extent that they operate in accord with the divine will.

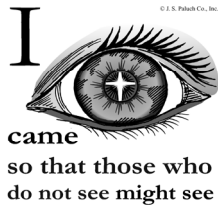
In the Gospel, Jesus heals a man who had never seen in all his life. One can imagine what it was like:

He had no memory of the faces of his parents, no sense how blue a summer sky is or even any concept of color. A world of utter darkness was completely normal to him. Perhaps he learned to find his way across the room when he was just a crawling baby.

Then one day he met Jesus and asked for the gift of sight. Jesus dabbed a bit of damp clay on his eyes and sent him off to wash. The story goes on to tell us that he began to see. He gets to learn to see. Like all of us, he learns to focus his eyes on an object, realize its shape, size, whether distant or close to him, sort the jumble of letters into words, estimate the speed of a moving object, etc.,

We also at the same time learn not to see: like shutting out distractions when we concentrate on a task at hand; We learn how to ignore unpleasant interruptions etc.

Unfortunately we also learned how to ignore things to which we should have paid attention: like the plight of the poor and the needy; the loneliness of the shut-in, the plight of the refugees fleeing from war torn countries etc. The man born blind received both physical and spiritual enlightenment. He now is able to see himself, the Pharisees, and Jesus as God sees all of them. No longer is he blinded by his culture's stereotypical view of him. No longer is he limited to the role he has been cast in his whole life – the sinner to be scorned. He has been awakened to new possibilities. He has seen by the light of Christ, and that will change everything.

Reflexiones del Párroco:

¿Cuántas veces, como directores de obras, juzgamos a las personas por su apariencia, voz o origen étnico? Tal vez esperamos aprender más acerca de su educación, trabajo, familia o situación económica. Tarde o temprano hacemos estereotipo de personas. Y una vez que los hemos puesto en esas cajas, resulta imposible imaginarlos de cualquier otra forma. Limitamos nuestra visión de quienes somos o son y de quien seremos o serán. La historia de cómo el profeta Samuel eligió a David para ser el rey de Israel es una de las historias más queridas en la Biblia. Hay elementos de humor y drama en el narrativo, pero el punto clave es contenido en la línea, "Porque Dios no juzga como juzga el hombre" (1 Samuel 16: 7). El autor quiere que tengamos claro el hecho de que Dios está guiando el destino de Israel y que nuestros esfuerzos humanos tendrán éxito solo a la medida en que operen de acuerdo con la voluntad divina.

En el Evangelio, Jesús cura a un hombre que nunca había visto en toda su vida. Uno puede imaginarse como sería: No tenía memoria de los rostros de sus padres, ni sentido de que azul era cielo en el verano o incluso cualquier concepto de color. Un mundo de oscuridad absoluta era completamente normal para él. Tal vez aprendió a caminar al otro lado del cuarto cuando era apenas un bebé arrastrándose. Entonces un día conoció a Jesús y pidió el don de la vista. Jesús aplicó un poco de barro húmedo en sus ojos y lo envió a lavarse. La historia continúa diciéndonos que comenzó a ver. Llega a aprender a ver. Como todos nosotros, aprende a enfocar sus ojos en un objeto, realizar su forma, tamaño, ya sea lejano o cercano a él, ordenar el revoltijo de letras en palabras, estimar la velocidad de un objeto en movimiento, etc.,. Nosotros a la misma vez aprendemos a no ver: como bloquear distracciones cuando nos concentramos en una tarea; Aprendemos cómo ignorar interrupciones desagradables etc..

Lamentablemente también aprendimos a ignorar las cosas a las que debimos haber prestado atención: como la difícil situación de los pobres y los necesitados; la soledad de los inválidos, la situación de los refugiados que huyen de la guerra en sus países etc.. El hombre nacido ciego recibió iluminación física y espiritual. Ahora es capaz de ver a sí mismo, los Fariseos y Jesús como Dios los ve a todos. Ya no es cegado por la vista estereotípico de su cultura. Ya no está limitado a la función que ha sido arrojado toda su vida: el pecador a ser despreciado. Él ha sido despertado a nuevas posibilidades. Ha visto a la luz de Cristo, y eso cambia todo.

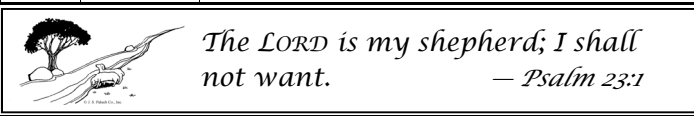
